DONATIONS

Holy Child families are asked to donate new or gently used items for the Market. There is no set limit on the amount you can donate, however it is suggested that you donate at least one item per person your child will be buying for (ex; if your child is buying for 4 family members we ask that you donate at least 4 items).

Donations will be collected at school December 4th-17th. Send your items to school with your child or bring them to the front entrance of the school and drop them in the Rubbermaid bins provided.

<u>SUGGESTIONS FOR NEW OR GENTLY USED DONATION ITEMS</u>: toys, games, craft items, scrapbook supplies, aprons, place mats, puzzles, baby toys, picture frames, books, posters, candles, candle holders, vases, jewelry, etc.

Please do not send movies, games, magazines or books that have inappropriate messages, pictures or themes. Stuffed animals are welcome but they must be clean and very gently loved.

RECESS AND ACTIVITIES: WEATHER

With the cold weather approaching, this is a kind reminder that students are to dress appropriately for the weather. Recess is important to children to provide a break from regular school routine, and a chance to get some fresh air. We will only cancel outdoor recess when Environment Canada determines that the temperature is below -20 degrees Celsius (including wind chill) or during wet, rainy days in accordance with District Procedures. Air quality is monitored similarly to extreme cold temperatures. The suggested guideline is that students do not go outside when air quality reaches an index of 7 or more. Whenever outdoor recess is cancelled, an inside, supervised recess break will occur.



<u>Learn to play CHESS at HOLY CHILD</u>



Learn and Play Chess at Holy Child School! Beginner chess lessons on Thursdays early dismissal for 10 weeks starting January 16, 2025 from 11:50am-12:55pm. Richard Pua, a chess expert with 19 years of experience teaching chess in schools, and Holy Child's chess teacher from the school years 2016-2020 and 2022-2023, will be offering an 65 minute class on Thursdays early dismissal. The topics covered are how to set up the board, how to move the pieces and how much they are worth, key ideas in how to play a good chess opening, how to checkmate with 1 queen or 2 rooks, what is a check, checkmate and stalemate, how to record moves in algebraic notation, how to attack the king's castle, tactics such as pins, discovered checks, forks, how to recognize standard checkmate patterns, scholar's mate and fool's mate, and procedure in how to select a chess move. Homework sheets are given out, and could be studied if the student wishes to improve his/her results faster. Don't let the idea of learning chess scare you. Chess, just like Math or Science, has some basic general principles. Just like learning ABC's and then writing words and sentences, students that give a decent amount of effort will soon see Discovered Checks, Forks, Pins, Italian and Spanish Openings and Attacking the King like child's play! Even a properly trained kindergarten student can beat most casual adult players. Holy Child Thursday chess will go for 10 weeks. Class time is from 11:50am-12:55pm. The first 25 minutes is for learning chess concepts. The remaining 40 minutes will be for actual chess playing, in order for the students to use the newly learned ideas. Students can bring their lunch and eat it during the chess class. First class and registration will be on January 16 and will run until April If there is sufficient interest, a second term of about 10 weeks will be added on after April 10. Class dates are Jan 16, Jan 23, Jan 30, Feb 6, Feb 13, Feb 20, Mar 6, Mar 13, Apr 3, Apr 10. No chess classes on Feb 27 (Teacher Convention), Mar 20 (No early day) and Mar 27 (Spring Break). Holy Child Thursday chess will be instructed by Richard Pua. With a current FIDE chess rating of 2003, Mr. Pua is a chess expert and in the top 20 players in Edmonton. Richard has taught thousands of juniors proper tournament chess play, in dozens of schools in Edmonton, Calgary and Fort McMurray. Many of his students have become provincial and national chess champions. He was the first teacher to Richard Wang, who is now an accomplished International Master and received a chess scholarship to attend Harvard, who himself became a chess expert (rating of 2000) at age of 10!
